Using the revolutionary new transdermal technology for eliminating insect bites, there seems to be a number of great questions. We've taken those questions most frequently asked and answered them here.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Will the patch work on other insects besides mosquitoes?

We've found that the patch also helps repel other biting insects including biting flies, gnats, no-see-ums, fleas, ticks that don't like the pheromones created and released through the skin when wearing the patch.



How long does it take the patch to start working?

The patch actually begins to enter the circulatory system as soon as you place it on your skin. It takes about two hours (depending on your activity level) to completely saturate your system and become fully effective against biting insects. The DeBug time-release formula then allows the patch to continue its effectiveness for up to 48 hours.

If I'm heavier than average do I need more than one patch?

Some cases show that a single user (depending on size and weight) may require two patches in a single application to achieve the desired result. If a single patch doesn't work for you, try two patches to test the result.

Will I get any skin irritation or reaction by using your patch?

No, however we recommend that each time you apply a fresh patch, it should be placed on a new area of skin. However, if you are allergic to adhesive tape or starch, you should consult your doctor before using.

Is your patch Hypo Allergenic?

Yes, the patch manufactured specifically for DeBug is hypoallergenic, however, if you experience a skin irritation we recommend that you stop using the product immediately and consult your doctor.

Do you have to wear the patch on a specific area of the body to be more effective?

No, however we recommend that you wear our patch on a hairless area of the skin to achieve the best possible contact. This will allow the full potency of the vitamin formula access directly into your circulatory system.



Is the transdermal process harmful?

The transdermal patch delivery system has been around since the early 1970's and is used by major pharmaceutical companies internationally. It uses the surface of the skin to get medications to the circulatory system quicker and more efficiently.

Is the DeBug Patch EPA approved?

The DeBug Patch contains no harmful chemicals or pesticides like DEET. It does not kill insects or harm the environment, it simply Keeps Bugs from Bugging You™ so there is no need for the EPA to evaluate or approve this product.

Is the DeBug Patch FDA approved?

Since the patch is not intended to prevent, diagnose or treat any illness or disease, the FDA has no need to evaluate the statements of the product. However, DeBug Patches are manufactured at FDA registered and approved facilities.



Can two people share by cutting the patch in half?

The DeBug Patch formula is designed for a single user. Each patch contains the exact amount to create a barrier that helps shield you from bothersome insects up to 48 hours. If you cut the patch in half you destroy the balance of the formula and therefore render the patch less effective to both users.

When I sweat, shower or swim will the patch wash off?

Since the patch uses a transdermal process it is absorbed through the skin into the circulatory system and therefore does not wear off in water or if you are active and sweat. Also once the patch is attached to the skin it forms an adhesive bond that will not allow water to penetrate through to the vitamin formula, so, it remains effective in the shower or while swimming.

Will the patch alter the effectiveness of other medications?

No, the DeBug Insect Repellent Patch contain all natural water soluble vitamins and there are no known medications that will interact with it, however, if you are taking prescription medications, you may want to talk to your doctor before using the Patch.

If I am pregnant, is it safe to wear the DeBug Patch?

Thiamine or Vitamin B1, the primary ingredient in the DeBug Patch, is in the FDA pregnancy category A. This means that thiamine is considered to be safe for use during pregnancy, however, if you feel uncomfortable, talk to your doctor before using the Patch.

My children are young; can I still use the patch on them?

Our patch uses natural water-soluble vitamins so it is safe and for use on children as young as one year of age. Plus, it contains no harmful chemicals or pesticides like DEET that can harm children.

Do my patches need to be stored in an airtight container?

No, once opened from the original packaging, the patch comes attached to a special "Release Liner" that resembles a peel off paper backing. The vitamin formula remains intact until the backing is removed. Only when the backing is removed and the vitamin formula is exposed to your skin or air the formula begins to breakdown.

How long will the patch last in my tackle box or golf bag?

The patch has a relatively long shelf life but will lose its effectiveness after three years.

Does the patch work better than just taking vitamin B1?

Yes, the transdermal process works with the bodies' own chemistry and uses a special membrane to control the all-natural ingredients as they are distributed through the circulatory system. Vitamins taken in liquid or pill form must pass through the body's digestive system. The acid in the digestive system breaks down these vitamins, removes some of the active ingredients and renders them less or non-effective.

If I am traveling overseas, can I bring the patch and use it?

Yes, the DeBug Insect Repellent Patches are all natural and contain no chemicals or pesticides like DEET that might be forbidden in foreign countries. Plus, with the new airline restrictions forbidding liquids or aerosols to be transported, the patch is the perfect travel mate.
